End of Life Choice Act referendum: Important update!

This Bill seeks to legalise euthanasia and assisted suicide in New Zealand.

As you will likely know, the End of Life Choice Bill passed its third reading, and now moves to a public vote - a referendum. So in September, all eligible New Zealanders will be asked to vote in the General Election, which will include a referendum question on what is now the End of Life Choice Act 2019. If more than 50% of voters vote 'No' to the Act, it will not come into law. If more than 50% of voters vote 'Yes', the Act will be made law.

We are getting in touch to let you know of an important development. A new 'Vote NO' organisation has been created to help educate the public about the dangers of the End of Life Choice Act 2019.
